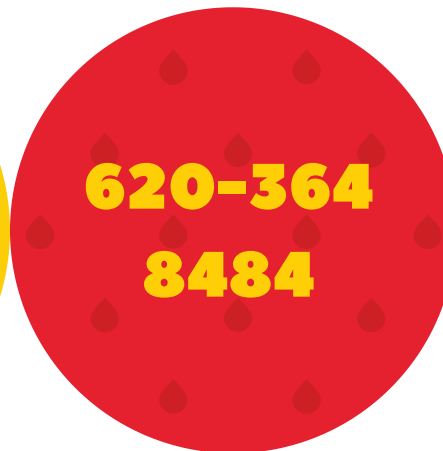

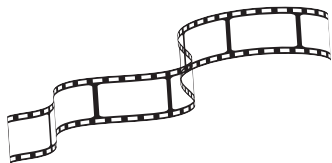

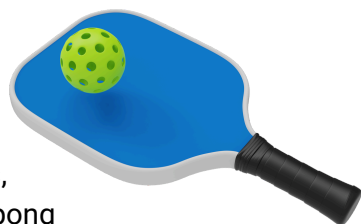
Deep Water Aerobics
